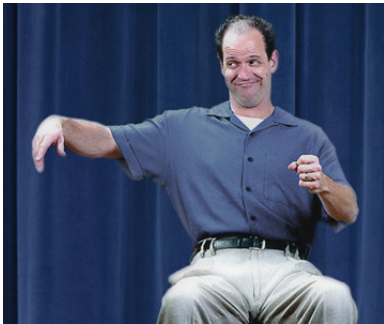




“Choose Character Over Bullying”

Performance + Message School Assembly Program by Cary Trivanovich

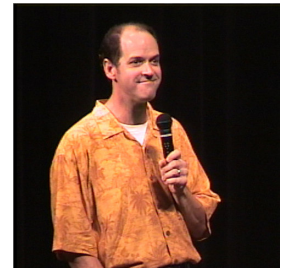

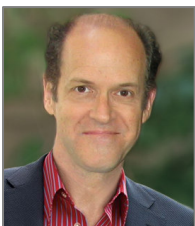
Cary's performance is a comedy/pantomime mix that Los Angeles theatre critics have called "perfect cartoons" and "as visually stimulating as it is funny to the bone." Cary's message is given in the second half of the assembly. It will be tailored to the age level and the specific climate and degree of bullying at your school. Whether about students who are bullying in ignorance

of how they are acting, or about the more serious staunch bullies, Cary's message speaks to the heart of every student.



- Cary effectively exposes the mindset of bullies, revealing their desire to *be somebody*, and how bullying ultimately accomplishes the opposite.
- He encourages the bullied, giving them helpful and practical advice.
- He explains that the notion of not tattling or "*snitching*" when students witness bullying is adolescent and dangerous, and that they should help victims of bullying by reporting and protecting.
- Cary culminates his message with the challenge to be the kind of peer who is a magnet for friends — unselfish and giving.



For nearly three decades, Cary Trivanovich has performed and spoken at over 3000 schools and youth conferences throughout virtually every state across America, and has spoken to kids and teens about bullying since long before *bullying* came to the forefront of concern in America’s schools. As a performing artist, Mr. Trivanovich has performed in theatrical and entertainment venues around the world, as well as teaching and directing is art for the Educational Theatre Association, NBC Studios, performing arts schools, and state theatre conferences throughout the United States.
